- B. COLLEGES, DIVISIONS & DEPARTMENCESU college, division, and department has a responsibility to ensure a safe environment for its employees and to maintain operations.

  - 2. Each college, division and/or department is expected conduct Ontinuity of Operations Planning (COOP) and, when necessary, put its continuity planain planai
  - 3. To ensure that colleges, divisions, and departments are prepared for emergencies, the above plans should be practiced attested at least annually, on or before June 1
  - 4. Building coordinators, otleges, divisions, and department should contact the Office of EHS for assistance in developing the shans.
- C. INDIVIDUALGiven that emergencies cannot always be avoided, common first line of defense is an individual's own initial actions (i.e., those things that a person does before emergency responders arrive). These actions include, but are not limited to, the following:
  - 1. Maintain situational awareness Individuals should remember that *t* at s core, situational awareress involves being aware of where they are and what is happening around them understand how information, events, and the *t* aware of will impact their safety and the ability to protect themselves, both now and in the near future.
  - 2. Take actions to proteconeself Based upon theiassessment of the situation, individuals should use their best judgment to protect themselveend, if possible, others (e.g., evacuate or shelterin-place).
  - 3. Summon assistanceCall for help. An LU community member or visitor can summon emergencyassistance

- 3. TheEPGalso provides resources and information to stabilize a campus incident as quickly as possible when requested through the inversity incident Commander and the LU Emergency Operations Center.
- 4. The EPGs comprised of members f the President's Executive Council (PEC); additional LU personnelmay be appointed as needed to respond to specific incident
- 5. When necessary, the EPG may establish tempowerkinggroups to manage incidents at require expertise held by members of a specifierkinggroup.
