í X The Hazlewood Exemption Application **Form 214** and signature

î X Report of Separation **Discharge, DD Form 214** (and DD Form 215 if the DD Form 214 has been amended) to verify the Veteran's place of entry, home of record at the time of entry, character of service, length of service, and dates of service. The copy you provide **DD Form 214** must be obtained from the National Archives.

- x If the Veteran was discharged prior to January 1, 1950 and previously used separate forms, the Veteran's **DD Form 214** was destroyed in the National Archives in 1973 or later, then the following documents may be used:
 - x NA Form 1303, Certification of Military Service
 - x Documentation from the National Archives that the Veteran's NA Form 1303 and DD Form 214 due to the DD Form 214 not being on file
 - x Documentation that Veteran met the requirements of Subchapter B, Chapter 59, Section 59.001, Texas Education Code, regarding resident tuition on the date of entry into active duty indicated on the DD Form 214

ï X Certificate of Eligibility for Federal GI Bill benefits – To verify eligibility for the education benefits, U.S. Certificates of Eligibility may be obtained by completing the application at <https://www.va.gov/eligibility>.

- x If the Veteran's final discharge is prior to 9/11/2001, the Certificate of Eligibility must be obtained from the VA.

x s **Form 214** (and DD Form 215 if the DD Form 214 has been amended) to verify the Veteran's place of entry, home of record at the time of entry, character of service, length of service, and dates of service.

ð X If the Veteran died while in service: Report of Casualty, Form DD Form 1300, or home of record and that his/her death was service related.

ñ X If the Veteran is deceased (not service connected) – Death Certificate for deceased and transfer.

ò X If the Veteran is totally disabled and individually unemployable due to military service, the Veteran must have a current (within one year) disability ratings decision letter from the VA.

ó X If you are not the Veteran, Relationship Documentation – Submission of the documentation of your relationship to the eligible Veteran.

- x Birth Certificate, Marriage Certificate, or Adoption Papers, or Recent Tax Return (<https://www.irs.gov/individuals/get transcript>).

ô X Veterans must reside in the state of Texas during that the exemption will be used.

- x Children and spouse of eligible Veterans must be classified as a Texas resident.

õ X Hazlewood Online Database Registration comply with the Federal Education Code requirements, all applicants (Veteran and dependents) must register into the Hazlewood Exemption at <https://hazlewood.tvc.texas.gov/students/>.
