Internet Use Policy Guidelines
Mary & John Gray Library
April 2002 Revision

Purpose

This policy is in accordance with guidelines set by the Federal Depository Library Program effective January 15, 1999:

All depository libraries must offer the general public free access to online Federal Government information provided through the Federal Depository Library Program (FDLP). This follows the same principle of free access that governs the use of traditional depository materials, as provided in Section 1911 of Title 44, United States Code.

Access to Products

Access to products in the FDLP Electronic Collection is available on all computers located in Gray Library. The link is on the Government Documents web site located on the library web page, which can be accessed externally. A shortcut to the collection is located on the desktop of the computer located in the Government Documents Collection.

User Fees and Restrictions

Gray Library does not charge a library use fee. Computers located in Reference are primarily for university staff, faculty, and student use, but are not limited to this user group. The computer in the Government Documents Collection is available for use by members of the university community and the general public. It is intended solely for assisting with government documents research. Computers are available as

Use of Depository Workstation

The workstation located in the Government Documents Collection is for use by both university patrons and the general public.

Fees for Printing and Diskettes

At this time the library does not charge for printing. The library sells diskettes.

Mediation of Use and Access

Computers located in Reference and Media Services are primarily for University patrons
